

2015? June 2015? Isn't that 3 years away? Not exactly. If you haven't noticed we are nearing January 1, 2013.



Preview of upcoming November-December CSSA Journal

The last issue for 2012 starts with a well-illustrated report from Fred Kattermann on the IOS congress held in Cuba earlier this year. A spectacular Melocactus evae, seen on the post-conference field trip, graces the cover. Closer to home, an article by Gary James and Christopher Drover highlights Dudleya stolonifera, a narrow endemic from the coast of Southern California. Infestations of our plants are an inevitable feature of our hobby, and Matt Maggio



draws our attention to a new and relatively poorly known pest of Agave, Agave mite. The article illustrates symptoms and suggests remedies, which will also be of interest to Aloe aficionados. Duke Benadom's popular series Superb Succulents returns after a short break, featuring outstanding specimens of Ariocarpus retusus and Pachypodium succulentum. John Pilbeam takes us across the 'Bridge of God' in search of Echeveria with a thoughtful look at the status of E. halbingeri and its subspecies sanchez-mejoradae. The issue closes with the all-important index to vol. 84, carefully compiled by Cody Howard.

Gift Exchange: Anyone may participate in this optional activity. Bring a cactus, succulent, or related item (one item per person). It must be in good condition (something you would like to receive). Attach a label with your name on one side and, if it's a plant, the species on the other. The plant or item that is deemed most desirable will be sold during the plant auction. The person who brought in that item gets first pick from all remaining items. The person who brought that item gets to pick next, and so on. As you can see, the more desirable the item you bring, the earlier you will likely get to pick!

Holiday Plants: Each member receives a Holiday Plant as an annual gift from the Club. Members are invited to bring in all surviving plants from previous Holiday Parties to show how well they have been grown, so remember to bring in your plants from years gone by.

Plant Auction: Bring Money! This is a great opportunity to purchase or sell rare or specimen sized plants. Items will be auctioned by some of our knowledgeable members. Auction Rules are:

- Must be a club member to sell.
- Limit of 3 plants or cactus/succulent-related items per member. (Other items may include artwork such as paintings and pottery, or just neat items with a cactus/succulents theme.)
- Plants must be mature, well-grown specimens rather than immature plants.
- Club gets 30% of the proceeds, seller gets 70%.
- Label your auction items with your name, and the minimum bid you'll accept. If the item is a donation to the club, then indicate such.

The auction is always great fun so, again, bring money, and come prepared to buy yourself a present! (After all.....who knows you better?)

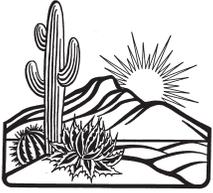
