This Month's Program**"The Baobab"**

Our speaker for July is Bruce Hargreaves. Bruce and his wife Polly have spent most of the past 45 years in Africa. He is a college professor with a PhD after his name, but his love is succulent plants. The Hargreaves are now living with relatives in Bakersfield due to economic conditions of their adopted country, Botswana. They have traveled extensively throughout southern Africa and are very familiar with succulent plant forms there. Their talk should be very interesting, don't miss it.

Bruce will tell us about baobab trees. The baobab talk consists of two parts: a somewhat scientific discussion of the biology of the trees as found in Malawi and their distribution in Africa, Madagascar and Australia. The second part consists of a tourist's look at trees in Botswana, especially those at a resort known as "Planet Baobab".

Plants Of The Month

Enter your specimen plants in our monthly mini-show. It will help you prepare for the real shows and give you an additional opportunity to show others your pride and joy. If you don't have any of these species of plants you can learn about them at the meeting.

CACTI and SUCCULENT OF THE MONTH —

DISH GARDENS

There are two closely related categories in most shows. One is planters, the other is dish gardens. Planters have multiple plants with some unifying theme. Usually the plants are the same genus or variations in a single species, or plants from a specific locality. Planters are limited to plants, with an unobtrusive rock or other natural object that would be typical of the locality.

Dish gardens on the other hand generally have props, an extremely decorative pot, or some other object that helps tell a story. In recent years winning dish gardens have had Chinese mud men as would normally be seen in a Penjing display, a rusted toy car, telling a story of unexpected difficulties on the road to Bahia de Los Angeles.

As with all other entries, health and condition of the plants is paramount. Beyond this, creativity and originality are the keys to success. Dish gardens are at their best for only a short time. It is best to put together a dish garden a few weeks before the show. This gives the plants time to root in and become established, and at the same time it a short enough time that one plant won't have time to over grow the others and destroy the art behind the display. It's perfectly acceptable to pot up a dish garden for display, and then replot the plants into separate pots after the show is over.


