I am pleased to report our first Board meeting, held on February 10, finds our club financially secure. With the CSSA Convention being held in nearby Woodland Hills, the Board voted to increase the amount of money available to sponsor our members who attend the convention. Anticipating increased attendance by our members, the club will subsidize up to one half of the convention registration fee. The total cost to the club will not exceed \$3000 (\$2000 was allocated for the last convention).
