Update On Sterilizing US Mail: I received a letter from Reta Renner of Grigsby Cactus Gardens in response to last months note about exchanging plants and seeds through the US mail.

Here is an excerpt: In answer to our inquiries we were told the USPS will only be sterilizing

mail sent to federal agencies in Washington, D.C. These agencies are located in the ZIP codes of 20202, 20203, 20204 and 20205. They do not plan to sterilize any mail sent to private parties or businesses.
